

PATRICIA BONHAM, LOCAL PARK HILL RESIDENT



We talk to Patricia Bonham, about a career that has ranged from Bermuda to Fiji, and a retirement that has helped many people in the community.

'I have never planned my life' says Pat, 'I have just seized what came my way. Once when I had just started a job in Sydney, they wanted someone to go for two weeks to a plant in a remote part of Western Australia. Who could resist an opportunity like that – paid travel, accommodation and adventure? I jumped at the chance and had a great time'.



By then she was a seasoned traveller. Starting as a receptionist in the City after leaving school, she soon moved on to working as a receptionist in hotels in England and developed the self-confidence she had lacked at school. In 1963, a friend persuaded her to join her in Bermuda. One thing led to another and she ended up working in a hotel there for two years. Armed

with that experience, she joined British Airways (or BOAC as it was known then) as a stewardess followed by another spell in Bermuda. Then after time back in Britain she was off again - on a slow boat to South Africa, and having explored different areas there, her friend Judy enticed her to be her bridesmaid in Australia.

After the wedding, Judy and her husband left for Fiji where they had managerial posts in a hotel. Before long Pat was offered a post as Public Relations Officer and Social Hostess at the hotel and off she went to Fiji. Here she was at her happiest. 'It wasn't a job.' she says, 'It was sheer enjoyment.' She got involved in the celebrations for independence and met Prince Charles in the process as well as coping with the aftermath of a hurricane. Then New Zealand, Fiji again and Australia where she travelled across the Continent by bus, and worked with the Royal Flying Doctor Service in Alice Springs (and climbed Ayers Rock as it was known then). During this time she met and subsequently married Kevin, a ground engineer with QANTAS. Sadly the marriage did not last but they remained friends.

Looking back on her travels, she was, she says, was very fortunate. Tourism was booming in the 1960s and 70s as jet planes made distant places accessible to ordinary people.

Anyone with the right mix of skills and experience could travel and work freely. But what emerges too was how well Pat learnt to work with the public - smoothing their way, overcoming difficulties with her sense of humour, and rising to the occasion.

These skills stood her in good stead when she finally returned to England in 1977 and took a job as a passenger service agent with British Caledonian Airways at Gatwick where she worked for nearly twenty years. For the final part of her career it was back to the City – as she described it 'the oldest office junior in the profession'.

However the skills she had gained in her travels were put to good use in retirement. She volunteered at Mayday Hospital as it was then known - first in the Friends shop and then on reception where she still works two afternoons a week. She greatly enjoyed the opportunities to be involved in initiatives like the Health Information Group where she helped vet leaflets for patients and the Buddy scheme escorting lonely patients to their appointments in out-patients. And there has been all her work for the Residents Association. She joined the Committee in 2002 and is still an active member - packing and distributing Newsletters, and delivering nearly two hundred copies, as well as collecting subscriptions - and litter. She is active too on the Management Committee for her part of Park Hill where she has now lived for nearly 40 years.

What is impressive about Pat is her commitment to all she takes on. Indeed when asked as to what drove her on, she immediately said 'Honouring my commitments to others'.



She manages however to fit in some time for herself – going to concerts (she is delighted with the new Fairfield Halls), going to art exhibitions, walking in Lloyd Park – her back garden as she calls it – and lunching with her friends. These days, due to 'retreating youth' as she puts it, she is much less active and adventurous than she was – but still keen to do what she can.

Her ambitions are to remain independent and to make the most of life – and it is typical that what irritates her most is people who are more concerned with themselves than with others. That will never be said of Pat. We thank her for all she does for others around her.






Daniel Spargo Mabbs died in January 2014 after taking an unexpected overdose of ecstasy at a rave. He was just 16 and a popular pupil at Archbishop Tenison's School. It was a huge shock to everyone, and his parent felt that if this could happen to Dan, it could happen to anyone. They wanted to do all they could to prevent this.

So, they set up a drug education charity in Dan's name, the Daniel Spargo-Mabbs Foundation, to try to prevent other families from having to go through the pain of losing a child, and to stop the damage done by drugs to young lives. The Foundation aims to improve young people's awareness of the risks of drugs and equip them to make safe choices. They are working with young people, their teachers and their parents and carers, and with other professionals working with young people, in schools, colleges and communities. They offer







workshops, resources for schools, training for staff and Theatre in Education. A moving play about Daniel – 'I Love You, Mum – I Promise I Won't Die' - was seen by 14,000 people earlier this year on its third professional tour, and will return to Archbishop Tenison's for a second public evening performance next spring – see the website for details.

The Foundation has grown rapidly from the start and needs more funds to continue and expand its work. See **www.dsmfoundation.org.uk** to find out how to give, or post donations to 18 Wyche Grove, South Croydon CR2 6EX.



Westfield

We wish that we could bring you some firm news about Westfield. All that we can report is that there was a 'productive' meeting at the end of October between the Council and Croydon Partnership which discussed progress on a revised scheme. The proposals include more offices and 'co-working spaces' (whatever they are), a hotel as well as shopping. Also under consideration are fewer parking spaces and more open space. But when will we see firm plans? And when might the redevelopment start? One informed guess is that the project would complete in 2024 -but don't bank on it. There is also a rumour that buildings on the site will start to be demolished in the New Year after the 'Christmas rush' - but which New Year?

East Croydon Medical Centre

Talking of long delays there were recently some signs of activity on the protracted renovation at East Croydon Medical Centre - but the impetus seems to have faded and the site is quiet again. We have tried in vain to find out from the practice when the current work is likely to finish –they simply don't reply to our enquiries. In the meantime the reception area at the practice is cramped and the 'temporary' staircase to the first floor is hard to access even by the able-bodied. It is surely time that conditions for both patients and staff improved.



Planning - 34 Brownlow Road

The owners of this property have applied to replace the chalet bungalow there with a four storey block of eight flats. There is already a single storey house at the rear of the site. We are strongly opposed to the proposed development. Its height and breadth are totally out of keeping with the surrounding area and will be very intrusive. It will affect not only the house at the back of the site but also

overlook houses in Rushmead Close. Replacing a small detached house just 1.5 storeys high with a four storey block of flats on a site which has already been partially redeveloped can only be achieved by intensive development which pays no regard to surrounding properties.

We are working with Councillor Vidhi Mohan and local residents to stop this intrusion.





OUR INTREPID CORRESPONDENT

YOUR CHAIR BRAVES THE ELEMENTS FOR ART'S SAKE

As your Chair fought his way through wind and rain to a concert at the Fairfield Halls on Saturday 26 October, he muttered to himself that it had better be good.

It was good – so good that it deserves to be in the Newsletter. Why?

First, a superb performance by the Croydon Philharmonic Society and the London Mozart Players of Verdi's Requiem. There was a chorus of over 150 who sang the lengthy and complex score by heart – and with heart. They ranged fluently from fortissimo to pianissimo. They had been rehearsing since since June and the effort was reflected in their mastery of the piece. They complemented a capable team of soloists -in particular Erica Eloff whose soprano soared into the sublime – and the London Mozart Players, our own orchestra at last back where they belong.

Second, the glory of the Verdi Requiem. It is a remarkable work, more like an opera than a Mass – passionate in its emotion and immediacy. 'Every number a cracker' as a friend of mine used to say of Bach's St Matthew Passion and this work shares the scale and range of that Passion. It is a massive masterpiece.

Third, the concert hall. Nearly fifty years after my first visit to Fairfield, it was a great joy to be at a concert there again. And oh that acoustic. I'd forgotten how good the Fairfield sound can be- resonant, reverberating, and clear – and the scale of this work and performance showed it off to the full. There was a marvellous moment when trumpeters (and there were seven trumpeters in the orchestra) sounded from the back of the hall flooding it with sound.

Fourth, the renewal of Fairfield after so many years of waiting. I used to say that I could paper my walls with plans for renovating Fairfield which never seemed to come to anything. Now we have so much more than a concert hall – so many activities appealing to a wide audience and so handsomely presented. On a winter's evening, the entrance hall is a sight to see from the main staircase.

There is room for improvement. No parking yet. Booking tickets on the website can be a pain. Finding out what is going on is not easy. Why don't they have a monthly programme on line and in print? On a busy wet Saturday night there were not enough staff on the bars or in the Cloak Room leading to irritable gueues.

But those things can be put right. In the meantime the sound of that performance lingers on. A cause for celebration - and anticipation of more good things to come.
